For reflection at home:

All:

Jesus found the people he ministered to sadly "harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." His response was to send flawed but gifted people among them, increasing pastoral provision. At this stage his was particularly focussed on his own kin "the lost sheep of the house of Israel." That Matthew says this shows a foundational blessing on Israel is but a precursor to the wider mission at the end where Jesus will say that's not enough, but sends them to make disciples of "all nations". (28:19) When Moses had first shared God's promise of relationship with Israel, he described them as "a priestly kingdom". "The whole earth is mine," God had said. When we were not allowed to gather for worship during lockdown, preparing liturgy for everyone to use at home mattered a great deal to some of us as clergy. For it was the only way we could be your priests. A priest is nothing without the people at prayer. Israel is nothing without the rest of the world. Their special relationship with God was never about superiority. It was about becoming the kind of kingdom that would be a blessing to all other peoples. The Hebrew tradition made Jesus possible. We are eternally indebted for their centuries of heart-searching and struggle with God out of which the universal reach of Christ could emerge.

Looking around we might identify who seems harassed and lost; who seems in need of guidance and protection; who needs healing.

We might ask who is likely to bring the blessing, guidance, healing they need. Will it be someone from within or beyond their immediate community? Who are the bringers of calm and reassurance in your life? In your community?

We affirm our faith

We stand and at home, if able, we turn to look in the direction of Church, to affirm our faith in God, revealed to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

APOSTLES' CREED

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
