# Foodbank requests:

#### <u>Urgently needed</u>

Tinned tomatoes, tinned spaghetti, tinned fruit (in juice - not prunes, rhubarb or grapefruit), baked beans, tinned fish (tuna, mackerel, sardines, salmon), tinned soup, jam/honey, chocolate bars, tinned rice pudding, tinned/carton ready-made custard, small jars of instant coffee (not decaffeinated), liquid/bar soap, gender neutral shower gel and shampoo, washing up liquid Low in stock

UHT semi-skimmed milk, sweet biscuits (not multi-packs, as they often have no ingredients listed), rice (500g), pasta sauce, tinned meat (ham, corned beef, pork sandwich, pulled pork, chicken), long-life fruit juice (not needing refrigeration), Pasta shapes and dry spaghetti, cereal (not greater than 500g), UHT whole milk, tinned/carton ready-made custard, tinned vegetables (carrots,

peas, sweetcorn), squash, porridge (not greater than 500g), dog food, cat food, tinned/packet vegetarian meals, sugar (500g), sanitary pads, toilet rolls, laundry liquid/powder (not family sized), instant hot chocolate (not cocoa powder), noodles, instant potato, nappies sizes 1-3, baby food and baby care items, gender neutral roll-on deodorants, razors, baby wipes, toothpaste, toothbrushes (single or duo pack), nappies (sizes 4-6).

#### Not needed at all

Tea bags (40's or 80's), crisps, tinned potatoes, decaffeinated drinks or fruit infusions, bottled water, large bottles of lemonade or coke, any food or toiletries containing alcohol, cooking ingredient or sauces, instant potato, tinned macaroni cheese, fresh products (including vegetables, fruit, meat, eggs and bread), non-dairy items, gluten-free items, coffee beans, loose tea, large boxes of teabags (120's or more), very large bags or boxes of porridge and cereal, cocoa powder, medicines, mouth wash, tampons, make up hair accessories, perfume or aftershave, Christmas or Easter items
