We gather

For those worshipping at home, have ready in an honoured place a portion of food and something to drink. It may be bread and wine or something else. Set your Bible alongside. You might light a candle.

Music as we gather:

- 1. Light a candle for thanksgiving! Sing to God for Christ the Lord! Born to Mary, dying, living; still the Spirit speaks his word. Welcome ev'ry tower pealing, celebrate two thousand years! Years of grace and years revealing Christ where Christ-like love appears.

- 4. Light a candle for tomorrow! Ask that countries may walk free: truly free, not bound to borrow, but released for jubilee. One has come among us bearing news that prisoners are restored: let his voice move us to sharing sing to God for Christ the Lord!

APOSTLE'S CREED

Deacon: We stand to declare our faith in God, made known to us as Father,

INTERCESSIONS

For those at home, responding to Jesus' Parable of Talents:

Pray for the Church that we recognise and set free the gifts God has given his people. Pray for all testing a vocation to ordination or Reader ministry.

Think of those whose talents are underestimated because of dyslexia, or ADHD. Pray for them and the classroom assistants and specialists who may help liberate them.

Think of those asylum seekers whose talents are underused because they are buried under migration bureaucracy, forbidding their work or delaying their schooling.

The harsh language of God's judgement in Zephaniah is difficult to hear, but read it again as images of the destruction in Gaza surface in your mind. We might turn this into a prayer that God search Jerusalem and Gaza with lamps and expose anything that needs to be exposed if we are to find peace there.

Gold and silver will not save, cries the prophet. We pray for any whose soul is oppressed and distracted by wealth.

Among those who are unwell, we pray for Norman Brookes and Paul Caney.

We remember those who have died including John Barlow and Dorothy Jones.

Deacon: You are children of light. Encourage one another and build up

We tell the story of salvation

Priest: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

Father, you made the world and love your creation. You gave your Son Jesus Christ to be our Saviour. His dying and rising have set us free from sin and death, and so we gladly thank you, with saints and angels praising you, and singing:

All: <u>Holy, holy, holy Lord,</u>

God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, thorugh Jesus Christ our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and , taking bread, he praise you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

A bell is rung

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praise you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did. In him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Deacon: Great is the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. **Amen**.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Deacon: As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power,

and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Priest: We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All: Though we are many, we are one body. For we all share in one bread.

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died and now lives for you, and feed on him in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.

We sing: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

We pause to remember all who pray at home, then share the bread and wine, now for us the body and blood of Christ.

SONGS during Communion
