CONFESSION

- Deacon: Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.
- Silence
- All: Lord our God, in our sin we have avoided your call. Our love for you is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes away early. Have mercy on us; deliver us from judgement; bind up our wounds and revive us; in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ABSOLUTION At home we pray for forgiveness. In church, the priest declares forgiveness for all, wherever we worship:

Priest: [May] The God of all healing and forgiveness draw *us* to himself, and cleanse *us* from all *our* sins, that *we* may behold the glory of his Son, the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

THE GLORIA

1. Glory be to God in heaven, peace to those who love him well; on the earth let all his people speak his grace, his wonders tell: Lord, we praise you for your glory, mighty Father, heavenly King; hear our joyful adoration and accept the thanks we bring. 2. Only Son of God the Father, Lamb who takes our sin away, now with him in triumph seated, for your mercy, Lord we pray: Jesus Christ, most high and holy; Saviour, you are God alone in the glory of the Father with the Spirit: Three in One!

We pray THE COLLECT for the Sunday next before Lent

Almighty Father, whose Son was revealed in majesty before he suffered death upon the cross: give us grace to perceive his glory, that we may be strengthened to suffer with him, and be changed into his likeness, from glory to glory; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

In church we stand and, when it is announced, we say: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Mark. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end:

This is the Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

SERMON

At home, you might take time to read through today's Eucharistic Prayer (p6-7 below) and weigh for a while the place of the law, the prophets and Jesus himself in helping God's people shape their identity. Ask yourself where the anchor points are for society today, as well as for the church. Then, ask yourself who your anchor people are; the people who help you feel sure of your identity; people who by similarity or contrast with you help you navigate this world.

Then spend a while thinking of people you have known well or encountered briefly who have seemed radiant, who have dazzled or humbled you. Give thanks for them.

Then, preparing for prayers, begin to think of people for whom you long to see transfiguration: a change, an opening, a dignifying of face.

We affirm our faith

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

We stand and at home, if able, we turn to look in the direction of Church, to affirm our faith:

Deacon: We stand to affirm our faith: All: We believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist.

> We believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again.

We believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world.

This is the faith of the Church. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

THE PEACE

Deacon: It is good for us to be here. The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

The Table is prepared in Church. At home, now is the time to say the Lord's Prayer (below) and consume the food and drink you have prepared, first praying:

God, whose Spirit unites and inspires us, with this symbolic meal bind me into the fellowship of the world wide church, and assure me of my place in your heart. **Amen**.

We tell the story of God's faithfulness

In Church we stand, if able, for the Eucharistic Prayer

Priest:The Lord be with you.All:And also with you.Lift up your hearts.We lift them to the Lord.Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.It is right to give thanks and praise.

Creating and liberating God, you called your people into covenant with you and sealed it with Moses on the mountain, you called your people back to that covenant through your prophets and spoke in a still small voice to Elijah on a mountain. Then on a mountain your Son Jesus stood between the Law and the Prophets and revealed the radiance of your gospel. On Calvary's hill your Son redeemed us by the blood of your new covenant, and on the mountain in Galilee he ascended to your right hand on high. And so we gladly thank you, celebrating your glory with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven, dazzled by your face and singing the hymn of your unending praise. All: Holy, holy, holy Lord. God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

> Dazzling God, you set up your tent and make your dwelling among us. Abide with us now through the power of your Holy Spirit, that your people may become a temple of your presence, and that these gifts of bread and wine may be for us the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Who, at supper with his disciples, took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to them, sating, "take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

> > A bell is rung.

After supper he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

A bell is rung.

Deacon: Great is the mystery of faith: All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

> Transfiguring God, it is good for us to be here. Through this holy sacrament make us your sons and daughters and be close to all children who have no one to share your love and mercy with them. Make us your beloved and visit all who have no one to call them beloved. Give us grace to listen to your voice and bring to your heart any who have no one to listen to them. Surround us with your prophetic company and take us up into the whirlwind of your glory, until the day comes when the waters of the Jordan are parted and the heavens are opened and the chariots bring us home to you, ever one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Deacon: As our Saviour taught us, so we pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Priest: We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.All: Though we are many, we are one body.For we all share in one bread.

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you. Eat in remembrance that he died for you and feed on him in your hearts with thanksgiving.

Jesus, Lamb of God, have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins, have mercy on us. Jesus, Redeemer of the world, give us your peace. (x2)

We share the bread and wine, now for us the body and blood of Christ. All are welcome to receive. If you prefer not to share the common cup, receiving just the bread is as much communion as receiving both. If you prefer not to receive but would value a prayer of blessing do come forward and simply keep your hands by your sides. We will pray for you.

For the sake of those with gluten intolerance, please do not dip your wafer in the wine.

SONG *during Communion* <u>We cannot measure</u>

1. We cannot measure how you heal or answer ev'ry suff'rer's prayer, yet we believe your grace responds where faith and doubt unite to care. Your hands, though bloodied on the cross, survive to hold and heal and warn, to carry all through death to life and cradle children yet unborn. The pain that will not go away, the guilt that clings from things long past, the fear of what the future holds, are present as if meant to last.
But present too is love which tends the hurt we never hoped to find, the private agonies inside, the memories that haunt the mind.

3. So some have come who need your help and some have come to make amends, as hands which shaped and saved the world are present in the touch of friends. Lord, let your Spirit meet us here to mend the body, mind and soul, to disentangle peace from pain and make your broken people whole.
