The first event will take place online, on **Thursday 21st March, 4.30–6.00pm** and will be centred around the theme "People not Property, Names not Numbers".

The webinar will explore the relationship between the Church and

slavery in terms of involvement, financial benefit, and the impact on religious teachings.
