The Word of God

NEW TESTAMENT READING Acts 10:44-end

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

PSALM 98 If you are able, you might stand to read this psalm aloud.

O sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvellous things. His right hand and his holy arm have gained him victory. The LORD has made known his victory; he has revealed his vindication in the sight of the nations.He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel.All the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God.

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises.Sing praises to the LORD with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody.With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the LORD.

Let the sea roar, and all that fills it; the world and those who live in it. Let the floods clap their hands; let the hills sing together for joy at the presence of the LORD, for he is coming to judge the earth. He will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with equity.

GOSPEL READING John 15:9-17

Jesus said: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.'

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH - THE APOSTLES' CREED

We stand and turn to look in the direction of Church, to emphasise our gathering around a precious, shared story:

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Prayers

We pray THE COLLECT for the sixth Sunday of Easter

God our redeemer, you have delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of your Son: grant that as by his death he has recalled us to life, so by his continual presence he may raise us to eternal joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the holy Spirit, one God now and fore ever. **Amen**

We pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us:

All: Our Father in heaven...

FOR REFLECTION

Think of a place, a community or a role where you have felt you truly belong. What were the conditions that made that feeling possible? What, in turn, did that feeling of belonging make possible?

Acts 10 is another wonderful moment in the early Christian community's discovery that more and more people truly belonged in their fellowship. Exclusion was not on, they realised. God was already busy in the lives of many outside the church. They were at first annoyed, then puzzled, then delighted.

We must consider, then, and puzzle and lament over the kinds of people church has excluded or made life difficult for over the centuries. Why on earth are so many pleasures and blessings in life sabotaged by our desire that other people shouldn't have what we've got?

Jesus' moving farewell reflections and prayers for his disciples and the church they will germinate include a great deal about belonging. Last week we heard about how humans flourish and bear

fruit if we abide in God. This week he exhorts us to help each other feel we belong. He tells us individually we are "chosen". This is not to make us feel superior, but to feel special. Everyone can feel special without superiority. This is not to belittle anyone outside the church. It is to make sure anyone inside does feel they belong. The beautiful Psalm of Praise today reminds us that thanksgiving and praise and wonder are all expressions of delight at the fact of our consciousness, of celebration at the surprise of being alive. To praise God is to express and effect our belonging in the world.

So let us pray about belonging.

We turn our reflection into PRAYERS:

Pray for the on-going life of the community or place you felt you belonged to.

If you perhaps feel less of a sense of belonging in your confinement at home, find things for which you can give thanks; aspects of the world for which you can give praise and things for which you can express wonder. It may be a simple as the birdsong heard from your window or the trembling blossom nearby. Express your praise in prayer and feel God's delight in your cognition.

Pray for those who came to mind when thinking about exclusion from the church or society. Pray for a healing of the lingering prejudice that still excludes.

Pray for any craving belonging, seeking refuge or asylum in a country not their own.
